BACKGROUND

To promote an environment where whistle-blowers are encouraged to report protected disclosures and other allegations or incidents in line with the Protected Disclosures Act ("PDA"), the TCTA Whistle-blower Policy and related procedures, TCTA requires an independent Anti-Fraud and Ethics Toll-Free Hotline. The appointment of an independent service provider supports TCTA's commitment to ethical conduct, independent reporting, confidentiality and the protection of whistle-blowers.

SCOPE OF WORK

DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF GOODS/SERVICES

Scope of work and measurable specifications

1.1 Core hotline and case-management service

- Provide and manage a unique toll-free Anti-Fraud and Ethics Hotline, available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and 365 days a year.
- Provide callers with the option of anonymity and separate reporting categories for fraud or corruption matters and ethics matters.
- Provide operator-assisted reporting in all eleven official South African languages.
- Transcribe each report accurately, allocate a unique reference number and classify it as fraud/corruption or ethics.
- Provide a secure Case Management System (CMS) with password-protected access for designated TCTA officials to view case status, reports and agreed CMS functionality.
- Maintain operational independence from TCTA management and disclose any actual or perceived conflict of interest that could compromise the service.

1.2 Reporting and escalation

- Transmit allegation reports to the Chief Internal Auditor, Chief Risk Officer, Chief Executive Officer and Audit and Risk Committee Chairperson, where applicable under TCTA escalation protocols.
- Provide separate detailed and summary monthly reports for fraud/corruption matters and ethics matters by the fifth working day of each month.
- Provide monthly reports in both PDF and Excel formats using predefined fields agreed with TCTA.
- Notify TCTA in writing within 24 hours of becoming aware of an actual or suspected data breach, security incident, unauthorised access, loss, disclosure or compromise of TCTA information.

1.3 Reporting channels and accessibility

- Provide two separate secure email addresses, one for fraud/corruption matters and one for ethics matters, with the naming convention agreed before implementation.
- Provide a hyperlink to a TCTA-branded Anti-Fraud and Ethics Hotline page from the TCTA intranet and website.
- Support Microsoft Edge and Google Chrome, or equivalent secure and widely supported browsers approved by TCTA.

1.4 Awareness, survey, training and communications

- Provide ten A3 and ten A4 laminated colour awareness posters. Renew content annually or when required.
- Issue a web-based or automated fraud and ethics survey to TCTA employees and service providers before 31 March 2027 and annually thereafter.
- Provide four two-hour training and awareness sessions per contract year, totalling twelve sessions over the contract period.
- Base training content on survey outcomes, TCTA improvement areas and relevant developments and trends.

- Compile one electronic newsletter per quarter on fraud risk management, anti-fraud and ethics management topics, for posting on the TCTA website and distribution to staff.

1.5 Information security, privacy, continuity and retention

- Protect whistle-blower reports in line with applicable POPIA and Protected Disclosures Act requirements and TCTA-approved security controls.
 - Protect the anonymity and identity of callers and prevent unauthorised disclosure of whistle-blower information.
 - Maintain documented disaster recovery and business continuity arrangements for the contracted service and submit evidence of a DR/BCP test completed within the preceding 24 months.
 - Sign a data-processing agreement before processing TCTA information.
 - At contract end or on written request, return or securely destroy TCTA data and provide written confirmation or a certificate of destruction, where applicable.
 - Maintain records in accordance with the legally and contractually required retention period. Bidder to identify the applicable retention basis and submit its documented retention procedure.
- Requirement not verified - source document required.

COMPANY EXPERIENCE REQUIRED

Bidders must demonstrate experience in providing and managing an Anti-Fraud and Ethics Hotline, rather than a general call-centre service, in the public or private sector. Experience must relate to qualifying projects completed within the past five years or currently being delivered.

Evidence rule: Bidders may submit either (a) a fully completed and signed Form A, or (b) signed client reference letters. A bidder is not required to submit both forms of evidence for the same project. TCTA may verify any evidence submitted as part of due diligence before award.

Form A must capture, at minimum: client organisation, project description and scope, contract start date, completion date or current status, contract/reference number where available, and contactable client representative. Reference letters must be on client letterhead, signed, and contain sufficient information to verify scope and delivery period.

PERSONNEL EXPERIENCE REQUIRED

The bidder must submit detailed CVs of the following Core Team Members:

THEREFORE, BIDDERS ARE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT ONLY THREE (3) CVS AND CLEARLY INDICATE THE DESIGNATIONS OF THE PROPOSED RESOURCES AS STIPULATED ABOVE.

DELIVERABLES

The Service provider shall meet the following requirements and provide services in this nature:

- 2.1 Provide a platform for the Anti-Fraud Hotline with a Case Management System (CMS) that is able to provide independent access to the designated TCTA official(s), using a password protected login access, to independently view relevant reports on the status of logged or reported cases. The TCTA designated official(s) should also be granted access to any other functionalities aligned to the service offering, as and when required.
- 2.2 **Contact Channels**
 - 2.2.1 Provide two (2) separate secure e-mail addresses which will safeguard the identity of the whistle-blower for fraud and ethics matters, i.e. TCTAFraud@behonest.co.za PLUS TCTAEthics@behonest.co.za.
 - 2.2.2 Case Management System (CMS) that ensures that whistle-blower's reports remain protected, in line with the Protection of Personal Information Act ("PoPIA") and Protected Disclosures Act ("PDA") requirements, and The Service Provider can grant access to the TCTA designated official(s) using a password protected log in access.
 - 2.2.3 A link to the TCTA branded Anti-Fraud Hotline, from the TCTA Intranet and Internet site, for access by staff and external stakeholders.
 - 2.2.4 The Browser with a compatibility that support Microsoft Edge or equivalent.
 - 2.2.5 Generate separate detailed monthly reports and summary reports for the "Fraud" and "Ethics" related matters. Reports should be user friendly and easily accessible to provide relevant information timeously.
 - 2.2.6 The TCTA Ethics and Fraud Hotline will be available for Whistleblowers and callers, and will attend to disclosures reported via the following channels:
 - i. Toll free telephone number;
 - ii. SMS;
 - iii. Freepost;
 - iv. Email address;
 - v. Online reporting on www.behonest.co.za;
 - vi. Live chat.
- 2.3 **The Anti-Fraud Hotline will include the following:**
 - 2.3.1 Provide callers with an option of anonymity and an option for "Fraud or corruption related" cases and "Ethics related" cases in English.
 - 2.3.2 All calls to the toll-free telephone number should be handled by a call operator, who will transcribe the information provided onto a report and allocate a unique reference number.
 - 2.3.3 The call operator should distinguish between "Fraud" and "Ethics" related allegations.

- 2.3.4 The information transcribed on to the report will distinguish between fraud and ethics allegations and be transmitted to the Chief Internal Auditor (CIA), Chief Risk Officer, Chief Executive Officer and the ARC Chairman.
- 2.3.5 Provide promotional awareness material to be displayed around the building: Ten (10) A3 Size laminated colour Posters and ten (10) A4 Size laminated colour Posters. The content of the Posters should be renewed annually or as and when required.
- 2.3.6 A web-based or automated annual Fraud and Ethics survey, sent to TCTA employees and service providers, before 31 March 2027 and annually thereafter.
- 2.3.7 Provide training and awareness on Fraud Risk Management to all relevant stakeholders quarterly, based on among others, the survey outcome; areas requiring improvement for TCTA; and new developments and trends in Fraud Risk Management and Ethics Management.
- 2.3.8 Compile an informative and educational Quarterly Electronic Newsletter, on Anti-Fraud and Corruption and Ethics Management topics, to be posted on the TCTA website and e-mailed to all TCTA staff.
- 2.3.9 The service provider shall perform the duties it is required to render in terms of this Agreement with reasonable skill, care and diligence and in accordance with the standards of care normally expected from the service providers performing a service of a similar nature.
- 2.3.10 The service provider shall professionally and efficiently deliver services in line with timelines that will be continuously agreed during the life of this contract.

2.4 Operating Hours

- 2.4.1 The TCTA Ethics and Fraud Hotline will operate and be available twenty-four (24)-hours a day, seven (7) days a week, three hundred and sixty-five (365) days a year.

2.5 Incident reports

- 2.5.1 The service provider shall ensure that TCTA shall receive incident reports within two (2) days of the reported incident.
- 2.5.2 High-risk allegations shall require a 24-hour escalation to TCTA.
- 2.5.3 An incident shall be deemed to be all information received through contact channels.
- 2.5.4 The service provider shall compile and present to TCTA incident reports monthly on a PDF document.

2.6 Languages

- 2.6.1 The TCTA Ethics and Fraud Hotline will accommodate all eleven (11) official South African languages during office and after hours.

2.7 Technical requirements

- 2.7.1 All information is stored on hardened servers with encrypted databases located within the boundaries of South Africa and is in compliance with the Protection of Personal Information Act, 4 of 2013 and the King IV Code.
- 2.7.2 The security on all voice loggings shall be guaranteed.
- 2.7.3 The Service Provider shall ensure the storage and recording of all calls, in line with the National Archives Act, and for at least three (3) years, or for the duration of the investigation or legal proceedings on matters reported via the Hotline.
- 2.7.4 The Service Provider shall ensure that the anonymity and identity of callers is protected.
- 2.7.5 No line identification or IP address information is captured or stored on the Anti-Fraud & Corruption Hotline Solution Software.

- 2.7.6 No recordings or transcripts of the recordings will be made available to TCTA or any other third party, unless ordered to do so by a court of law.
- 2.7.7 The physical address of the TCTA Ethics and Fraud Hotline is undisclosed, and access is restricted by biometric access.
- 2.7.8 All computer hardware and software access is protected by multiple layers of access control and/or network authentication, and no unauthorised users to have direct access to the hardware and data storage.
- 2.7.9 The Service Provider has a thorough and robust Disaster Recovery and Continuity Plan in place, made effective through constant revision, testing, and improvements. This guarantees TCTA continuity of operations, in the event that The Service Provider has experienced an Emergency or Disaster.

RETURNABLES

The bidder must submit a fully completed Pricing Schedule as incorporated in the RFQ document.

SCM Bidding Forms: SBD1, SBD 4 & SBD 6.1 must be fully completed and signed.

A valid BBBEE Certificate issued by a Verification Agency Accredited by SANAS, or a Sworn Affidavit for EME and QSE. Consolidated BBBEE for Joint Venture tenderers issued by Agency Accredited by SANAS, or a Sworn Affidavit for EME and QSE (**Refer to Annexure E and F**). **Bidders must complete one of the Sworn Affidavit applicable to their company (EME/QSE).**
