

SPECIFICATION FOR THE PROVISION OF ON-SITE TRAINING AERODROME RESCUE FIRE-FIGHTING SERVICE (ARFFS) PERSONNEL FOR FIRE INSTRUCTORS NFPA 1041 and Fire Inspector NFPA 1021

1. INTRODUCTION

- GAAL provides compliance training to aerodrome rescue fire-fighting service (ARFFS) personnel for Fire Instructors NFPA 1041 and Fire Inspector (Fire Prevention) NFPA 1021 as it is a requirement from South African Civil Aviation Authority (SACAA) and the service provider must be able to provide onsite training.

2. BACKGROUND

- GAAL operation department (fire & rescue) has a finding that both Shift Controller needs to be train in Fire Instructor 1 NFPA 1041 as soon as possible to close the findings
- Fire Instructor 1 NFPA 1041 Training by Officers and Firefighters must be done for the several important reasons:
 - It's for SACAA compliance – To close finding
 - Standardized Instruction Quality – NFPA 1041 sets the national standard for fire instructor qualifications, ensuring that supervisors deliver consistent, accurate and effective training. The standardization is critical in an airport environment where safety protocols must be rigorously maintained
 - Enhanced Training Effectiveness – Supervisors who are certified as Fire Instructor 1 have demonstrated the ability to design, organize, and deliver training sessions effectively. This ensures that firefighters and rescue personnel at the airport are thoroughly prepared to handle emergencies, including aircraft fire, fuel spills and rescue

- Safety Compliance and Risk Reduction – Airport are high-risk environments requiring strict adherence to safety regulations. Trained fire instructor ensures personnel understand and follow NFPA codes, SACAA regulations, and airport-specific emergency procedures, reducing the risk of injury and property damage
- Leadership and Development of Firefighters – Being certified as Fire Instructor 1 equips supervisors with skills to mentor, evaluate, and develop the competencies of their team, fostering a culture of continuous improvement and professional growth within the airport fire and rescue service
- Accreditation Requirements – Regulatory bodies (SACAA) require documented proof of qualified instructors leading fire and rescue training, NFPA 1041 certification meet these requirements, supporting the airport accreditation and compliance status
- Fire Inspector 1 NFPA 1021 certification meet requirements for CAA CARS 139.02.30 and 139.01.9 on fire prevention training which is to be provided for fire prevention officers.
- NB: In summary, Supervisors conducting Fire Instructor 1 NFPA 1041 training at airports ensure high-quality, standardized instruction tailored to airport-specific hazards, enhance safety compliance, improve emergency preparedness, and fulfil regulatory obligations. This strengthens the overall effectiveness and professionalism of the airport fire and rescue teams and Fire Prevention Officers carry out fire prevention inspections as per CARS Part 139.02.30 and 139.01.9

All quotations will be evaluated in terms of administrative requirements, and preference point system.

3.1 Gate 0: Administrative (mandatory) requirements

The bidder(s) quotation will be disqualified for non-submission of any of the documents.

- 1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.

- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) **“tender”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) **“price”** means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) **“rand value”** means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) **“tender for income-generating contracts”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and

4.6. I, the undersigned, who is duly authorised to do so on behalf of the company/firm, certify that the points claimed, based on the specific goals as advised in the tender, qualifies the company/ firm for the preference(s) shown and I acknowledge that:

- i) The information furnished is true and correct;
- ii) The preference points claimed are in accordance with the General Conditions as indicated in paragraph 1 of this form;
- iii) In the event of a contract being awarded as a result of points claimed as shown in paragraphs 1.4 and 4.2, the contractor may be required to furnish documentary proof to the satisfaction of the organ of state that the claims are correct;
- iv) If the specific goals have been claimed or obtained on a fraudulent basis or any of the conditions of contract have not been fulfilled, the organ of state may, in addition to any other remedy it may have –
 - (a) disqualify the person from the tendering process;
 - (b) recover costs, losses or damages it has incurred or suffered as a result of that person's conduct;
 - (c) cancel the contract and claim any damages which it has suffered as a result of having to make less favourable arrangements due to such cancellation;
 - (d) recommend that the tenderer or contractor, its shareholders and directors, or only the shareholders and directors who acted on a fraudulent basis, be restricted from obtaining business from any organ of state for a period not exceeding 10 years, after the *audi alteram partem* (hear the other side) rule has been applied; and

- (e) forward the matter for criminal prosecution, if deemed necessary.
