TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE FACILITATION OF EVENT SAFETY MANAGEMENT TRAINING FOR DISASTER MANAGEMENT OFFICERS AT THE UGU DISTRICT DISASTER MANAGEMENT CENTRE.

MINI TENDER

1. BACKGROUND

In line with the Disaster Management Act, 2002 (Act No. 57 of 2002), the Safety at Sports and Recreational Events Act, 2010 (Act No. 2 of 2010), the Safety at Sports and Recreational Events Regulations, 2017, the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act No. 85 of 1993), SANS 10366:2015: Health and Safety at Events – Requirements, and other applicable safety legislation, the District Disaster Management and Fire Services Unit intends to facilitate Event Safety Management training for twenty (20) Disaster Management officers. The training will be conducted at the Ugu District Disaster Management Centre and is intended to strengthen the officers' knowledge of event safety planning, risk assessment, compliance requirements, command and control, emergency preparedness, crowd safety and coordinated response arrangements for public events. The Disaster Management Centre therefore requires an experienced and suitably qualified service provider to undertake the training and related logistical support as outlined in these Terms of Reference.

2. TIME DURATION AND SCOPE OF EVENT SAFETY TRAINING

- The project duration shall be between one (1) and three (3) months from the date of appointment.

Targeted Group: Twenty (20) Disaster Management officers.

Programme Purpose: The purpose of the training is to strengthen the capacity of Disaster Management officers to plan, assess, coordinate and monitor event safety arrangements in accordance with applicable legislation, standards and municipal emergency preparedness requirements.

Training Venue: The training shall be conducted at the Ugu District Disaster Management Centre. The appointed service provider must confirm all logistical requirements with the municipality before commencement of the training.

4. TRAINING

- a. To provide training on the legislative and regulatory framework governing event safety management, including **SASREA** and related regulations
- b. To capacitate officers on event safety planning, pre-event risk assessment and compliance requirements
- c. To cover crowd safety, venue safety, emergency access, evacuation planning and public safety considerations
- d. To strengthen understanding of command and control, role-player coordination, incident reporting and emergency response arrangements during events
- e. To guide officers on the development, review and implementation of event safety and security management plans
- f. To ensure that officers are able to interpret event safety documentation, identify compliance gaps and provide informed technical input during event planning and safety coordination processes

4.1 ACCOMMODATION, TRANSPORTATION AND REFRESHMENTS

The appointed service provider is responsible for own accommodation, transportation and refreshments.

The quotation must clearly separate costs for training facilitation, training material, assessment or evaluation, certificates, and any other applicable logistical requirements. No additional costs outside the approved quotation shall be accepted by the municipality.

- An abridged curriculum vitae for each team member assigned to the project.

- Proof of similar work completed previously, supported by client reference letters.

- Copies of qualifications relevant to the scope of work.
- A proposed training manual.
- A detailed cost breakdown for training facilitation, accommodation, transportation, refreshments, training materials, assessment, certificates and close-out reporting.
- Confirmation that the training content will include practical examples, assessment or evaluation of learning, and alignment with SASREA, applicable regulations and SANS 10366:2015.

7. FINAL REPORT

The appointed service provider must provide Ugu District Municipality with the following deliverables upon completion of the training:

- A close-out report, including the final training manual.
- Copies of certificates issued to participants.
- Attendance registers signed by all participants.
- Evidence of training facilitation, including photographs where applicable, assessment results or evaluation forms, and any training presentation material used.

All training documents and certificates must reflect Ugu District Municipality information and include the municipality's logo.

Expected Outcomes: Upon completion of the training, the twenty (20) Disaster Management officers should understand the legislative requirements for event safety management; apply basic event risk assessment and compliance principles; understand crowd safety, evacuation and emergency response coordination; and contribute to the preparation, review and implementation of event safety and security management plans.

1.4 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.

1.5 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim regarding preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) “**tender**” means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) “**price**” means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) “**Rand value**” means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) “**tender for income-generating contracts**” means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) “**The Act**” means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

3. FORMULAE FOR PROCUREMENT OF GOODS AND SERVICES

3.1 POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

3.1.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

3.2 FORMULAE FOR DISPOSAL OR LEASING OF STATE ASSETS AND INCOME GENERATING PROCUREMENT

3.2.1 POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

3. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 3.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 3.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
- (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or
 - (b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system,

- 1 This Municipal Bidding Document (MBD) must form part of all bids' invited.
